



Dear Naperville Citizens,

It is my pleasure to present the 30th edition of the Crime Prevention Calendar. Thank you to the following sponsors for their support in creating and printing the 2016-17 calendar: Naperville Community Unit School District 203, Indian Prairie School District 204, All Saints Catholic Academy, Bethany Lutheran School, Calvary Christian School, Ss Peter & Paul School, St. Raphael School, The Naperville Exchange Club, Naperville Junior Woman's Club, and Naperville CrimeStoppers. The calendar project provides elementary school children in our community the opportunity to create artwork depicting important crime prevention messages.

This year's cover photo features School Resource Officers (SROs) and the Copenhagen Schoolhouse located on the grounds of Naper Settlement. The School Resource Officers play an important role in our schools in Districts 203 and 204 by developing and maintaining positive relationships with the students, faculty, and school communities they serve. School Resource Officer support began in the Naperville area schools in the year 2000. The SROs work collaboratively with their schools to facilitate proactive and preventative programming as well as partner with school staff to maintain safe learning environments for all students.

The original Copenhagen Schoolhouse was built in the late 1840s and was utilized as a school until approximately 1922. The one room schoolhouse was located at the southeast corner of Route 59 and 83rd Street. Along with a small church and a few farms, it made up the community once known as Copenhagen Corners. Following an inspection of the building from an historical architect in 1981, the original Copenhagen School was determined to be beyond repair or restoration. As a result, the Naperville Heritage Society decided to replicate the structure as the last one-room school from the Naperville area. This reconstruction of the old schoolhouse is seen on the Settlement grounds today and is featured on this calendar cover as the setting for the School Resource Officers and current Naperville school children.

While the physical structures of our schools have certainly grown and changed over the years, the constant is that our community is fortunate to have successful school systems which work collaboratively with the citizens and police in order to educate students and keep them safe. Thank you to the generations before us in the little school that taught large lessons and the students who created artwork represented in this calendar.
