### Laura Ingalls Wilder: The Real Story

To celebrate the 150th birthday of Laura Ingalls Wilder, Laura Keyes will portray the American writer best known for the Little House on the Prairie book series. Hear the real history of Laura Ingalls Wilder and discover the times, places and people who inspired her wonderful books.

### Helen Keller - A Life Nearly Lost

Sunday, March 12, 4-5 PM

Helen Keller overcame adversity through the help of Anne Sullivan, a determined young teacher that would find the key to unlock Helen's prison. Through Anne's diligence and perseverance, Helen would become a world renowned speaker and advocate for the disabled. This program, originally commissioned by the Lion's Club International, Northern Illinois Division, begins with Jessica Michna portraying Helen, who was blind and deaf, being led to the podium where she recites excerpts from the 1925 speech Helen gave to the International Lion's Convention. The program continues in third person as Michna tells the audience of Helen's life and experiences.
